

#### **Seesaw Messaging Function**

We have made the very difficult decision to disable the Seesaw messaging function this term. This has been a facility that staff and parents alike have availed of since the beginning of covid, however, it has sadly become too much of a burden for our teaching staff. Whilst the function was great for parents to send a message, it was becoming impossible for staff to manage and reply to the volume of messages coming through all whilst trying to teach a class full time simultaneously. Most parents did use the app appropriately but there was a number of messages still being sent to teachers very late at night and during weekends, which was having an impact on our staff work/life balance. At St Eugene's the wellbeing of everyone in our school community is important, therefore, we are returning to more traditional means of communication between home and school. Parents are asked to telephone the office for queries and to report absences through Mrs Gallagher or alternatively send a note with your child. If any communication requires a response from a teacher, we will get back to you in due course, however, please be aware that this may not be on the same day unless urgent.
