

Homework

Seesaw

Seesaw is our online learning platform and is a great tool for allowing adults at home to see what is going on in our classrooms. We know that so many of you love it! You can have multiple children on your Seesaw app and switch between them using the top left-hand corner. Seesaw is useful for communicating with your child's teacher, but we ask that only short, non-urgent messages are sent this way. During the working day teachers may not see messages or be able to respond. For more urgent messages please telephone the office after 9.30am and leave your message with Mrs Gallagher to pass on to the class teacher. If calling before 9.30am please leave a recorded message.
